# WELCOME TO **THEATRE PROJECTS MANITOBA**AND **WALK&TALK THEATRE CO**.

The creation of End of the Line began with a place: Heart City. A fictional coastal community destroyed by a Flood. And from the seed of that city, the rest of the show took shape. After half a decade of workshops and rewrites, Heart City remains unchanged.

It can be easy to forget that Winnipeg, this place we get to call our home, is as much a player in our lives as we are. This land and the waters that flow over it are the seeds of a story that we've been telling for thousands of years. It hasn't always been a happy story. But we are lucky have a chance to join the narrative.

This production has been workshopped, rehearsed and now presented in the heart of downtown Winnipeg on Treaty One Territory. Winnipeg is a city that knows flooding—that sits at the crossroads of two rivers and in the heart of the Hudson Bay Drainage basin—the largest ocean watershed in Canada. This watershed encompasses all the territory we know as Manitoba including Lake Winnipeg, Lake Manitoba, the territory of Treaties One, Two, Three, Four and Five, the Seal River Watershed, and Shoal Lake 40 Frist Nation where we get our water.

We are grateful to all the people of these lands, the Anishinaabeg, Ininew, Oji-Cree, Dakota and Dene and the Red River Métis Nation, and especially to the Sayisi Dene, Northlands Denesuline First Nation, Barren Lands First Nation and O-Pipon-Na-Piwin Cree Nation and all others who work to conserve and restore the health and vitality of these lands and waters.

Because there are no songs to sing, no steps to dance, and no stories to tell, without a place to share them.

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

It is a very special feeling when someone shares their heart and soul with you and Walk&Talk Theatre has been on the receiving end of that in droves. We could not be more thankful. This has truly been an unforgettable hell of a run!

# THE ROAD TO END OF THE LINE

End of the Line was first conceived back in 2018 after the first run of Walk&Talk's The Ballad of Johnny Boy in the Winnipeg Fringe Festival. After the first of many workshops in conjunction with MAP, we presented excerpts from End of the Line at the Prairie Theatre Exchange Festival of New Works in 2019 and later that year after further development through a residency at the IISD-ELA, we began talks with Theatre Projects Manitoba resulting in an official commission of the piece.

"Dream Big!" are the words we were sent off with from then Artistic Director of TPM, Ardith Boxall. And dream we did. Limitless possibilities, endless characters, and boundary-less music were brought to life before we, along with the rest of the world, were hit with a set back of sorts at the start of 2020 which halted the project for a time.

As 2020 drew to a close Ben re-envisioned the initial concepts we'd been working with and began writing a series of short stories centered around a contemporary flood mythology. At the start of 2021 Duncan wrote and recorded 11 songs in two weeks based on prompts in the stories. Joined by some near and dear friends, we had our first reading over Zoom in February of 2021. This was followed by Music Workshop and a Movement Workshop in the summer/fall where we began working with our current cast/band.

With workshop feedback securely in place we started splitting stories into scenes and arranging lead sheets into scores, presenting a full Staged Reading/Sing-Through at the West End Cultural Centre in April of 2022. A year later, MAP hosted another reading of the script for a fresh perspective and soon after we held a workshop week focusing on movement explorations.

2024 shook things up big time with a total strip down and recreation of the script and score as we finalized production drafts. Cue the start of rehearsals. To sum it up, this piece has been crafted through years of generous collaboration with many artists, including:

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


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
